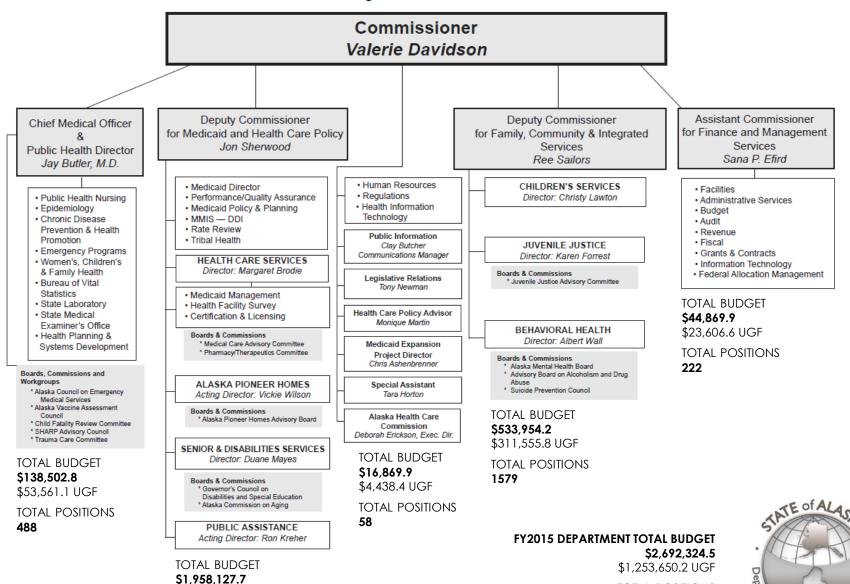

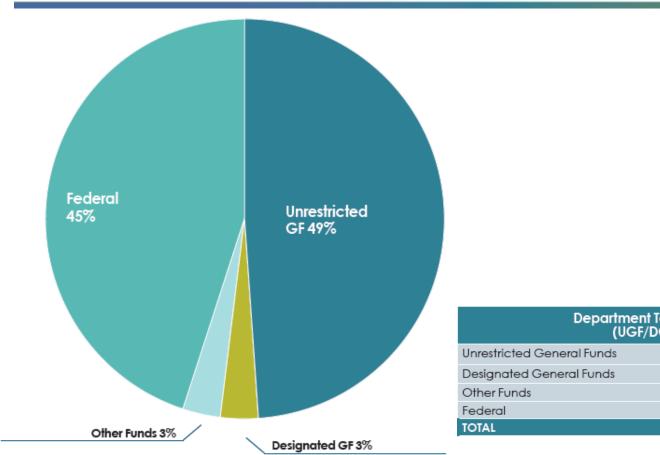

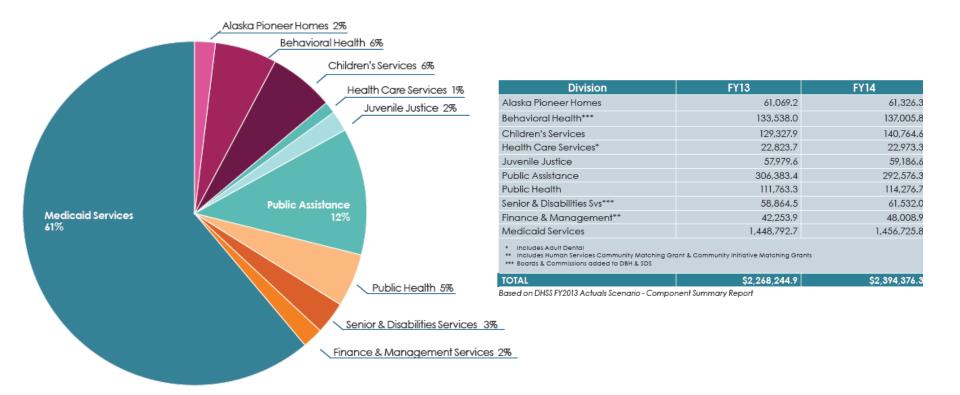

(Total Funds)

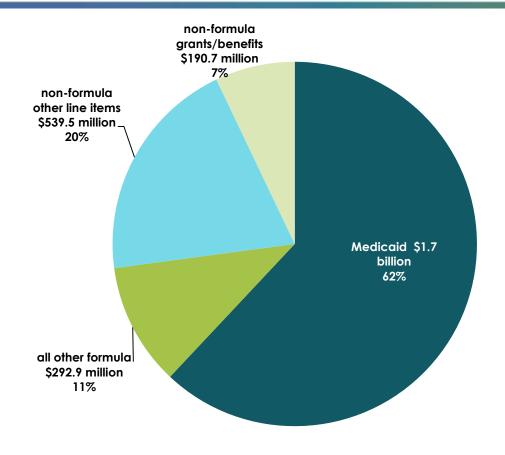

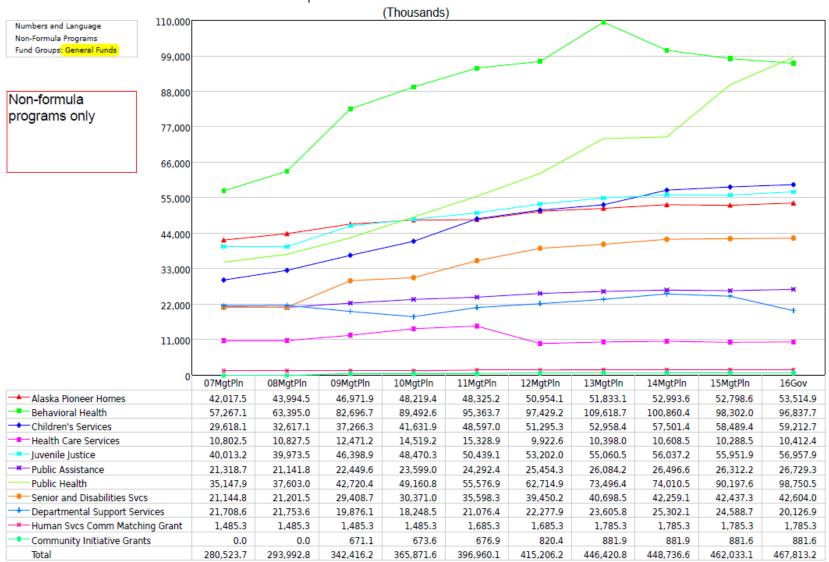




Multi-year Appropriation Summary - Operating Budget - FY 2016 Governor Structure Department of Health and Social Services
