Dear Senate Finance Committee,

I would like to encourage you to reconsidered your cutting of the budget for programs such as the Farm to School program and other State Agriculture programs like the Mt. McKinley Meat, and Potato programs. Our State's agriculture is in a nascent and fragile state as it is, cutting these programs now would have a hugely detrimental effect on currently blossoming local interest, and entrepreneurship in agriculture.
