The Municipal Grants and Loans (MG&L) program offers low interest loans and matching grants to the State's larger incorporated municipalities. MG&L grants require a local match between 15% and 40%, depending on the population of the community. The Village Safe Water (VSW) program offers 100% grants to second class cities and smaller communities throughout the state.
