Analysis

HB 47 will alter the interest rate that must be paid by certain municipalities on delinquent payments to the Public Employees Retirement System. Only municipalities whose population decreased by more than 25 percent between 2000 and 2010 would be affected. The bill is retroactive to July 1, 2009.
