1 CITY OF NORTH POLE 2 **RESOLUTION 15-10** 3 A RESOLUTION OF THE NORTH POLE CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING 4 HOUSE BILL 118 AND SENATE BILL 56 "AN ACT ADOPTING THE 5 MUNICIPAL **PROPERTY** ASSESSED **CLEAN ENERGY** ACT: 6 AUTHORIZING MUNICIPALITIES TO ESTABLISH PROGRAMS TO 7 IMPOSE ASSESSMENTS FOR ENERGY IMPROVEMENTS IN REGIONS 8 DESIGNATED BY MUNICIPALITIES; IMPOSING FEES; AND PROVIDING 9 FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE" 10 11 WHEREAS, HB 118 and SB 56 was introduced by Governor Walker to create the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program to help Alaska businesses finance 12 retrofits on their buildings to make them more energy efficient; and 13 WHEREAS, assessed clean energy programs allow property owners to finance 14 qualifying energy efficiency improvements overtime through a voluntary assessment on 15 the property tax bill; and 16 WHEREAS, implementation of the PACE program is voluntary by municipalities and 17 commercial property owners; and 18 WHEREAS, mortgage holder consent is required before applications are approved and 19 assessments are placed; and 20 WHEREAS, improvements can include lighting upgrades, renewable energy, 21 conversion to natural gas, high-efficiency boilers, and additional energy efficiency 22 improvements; and 23 WHEREAS, the repayment obligation transfers with the sale of property; and 24 25 WHEREAS, PACE programs were named one of the top 20 "world-changing ideas by Scientific American magazine"; and 26 WHEREAS, energy efficiency upgrades are financed with capital secured by a primary 27 lien on the property, lower-interest capital and favorable repayment terms that can be 28 raised from the private sector; and 29 30 WHEREAS, PACE allows for longer repayment periods allowing the building owner to recognize immediate operating savings while repaying the debt; and 31 32 WHEREAS, PACE can use traditional lending sources; and WHEREAS, PACE Programs in Alaska, provide consistency with state energy policy, 33 energy efficiency and renewable energy goals; and 34

35 WHEREAS, 31 states have authorized PACE programs; and WHEREAS, the Alaska State Legislature must provide authority for local governments 36 to establish and operate commercial PACE programs; and 37 38 WHEREAS, in the State of Alaska there are 24 eligible local governments with a total population of 639,314; and 39 WHEREAS, Improvements may not be made to vacant lots or property undergoing 40 development at the time of assessment; and 41 WHEREAS, PACE programs may not be used to finance the purchase of temporary 42 43 products or anything not permanently fixed to real property 44 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the North Pole City Council supports 45 implementation of House Bill 118 and Senate Bill 56. 46 PASSED AND APPROVED by a duly constituted quorum of the North Pole City 47 Council this 16th day of March, 2015. 48 49 50 Bryce J.
