## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

### Analysis

HB169 adds a section to the uncodified law of Alaska regarding "Review of Electric Utility Interconnection" that requires the Regulatory Commission of Alaska to report whether creating an independent entity that meets the requirements to manage the electrical transmission facilities in the Railbelt area is the best option to provide for effective and efficient electrical transmission, including economical distribution, reliability of electrical service, and nondiscriminatory, open access to transmission services.

The fiscal impact of this legislation cannot be accurately determined at this time.
