A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- "An Act relating to the duties of the Department of Education and Early Development;
 relating to the duties of school districts; relating to course mastery requirements;
 relating to school funding; relating to training for school employees and mandatory
 reporters of child abuse or neglect; relating to layoff of tenured teachers; relating to
 fiscal notes prepared by the Department of Education and Early Development; relating
 to notification of proposed agency actions; and repealing requirements for minimum
 expenditures for instruction."
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- 9 * **Section 1.** AS 14.03.073(a) is amended to read:
- 10 (a) A school district shall provide the opportunity for students enrolled in
 11 **grades nine through 12** [A SECONDARY SCHOOL] in the district to challenge **one**12 **or more courses** [A COURSE] provided by the district by demonstrating mastery in
 13 mathematics, language arts, science, social studies, and world languages at the level of

1	the course challenged. A school district shall give full credit for a course to a student
2	who successfully challenges that course as provided under this section.
