

supervision of a qualified practitioner; these services may be provided to a person who is a patient in an intermediate care facility or skilled nursing facility.

(13) "hospice services" means services provided under a coordinated comprehensive program of palliative and supportive care on a 24-hour, seven days per week basis to persons who have been diagnosed as terminally ill and their families by an interdisciplinary team of professionals or volunteers under an incorporated central administration that has a physician as medical director;

(14) "major medical" means health insurance or medical care coverage provided on an incurred basis, including Medicare supplement insurance;

(B) does not include coverage for dental only, vision only, long-term care, home care, home health care, community-based care, accident only, disability income, hospital confinement indemnity or other fixed indemnity, or credit, disease or specified accident, or other supplemental health insurance or coverage determined by the board not to constitute major medical and approved by the director;

(15) "medical social services" means services rendered to the patient under the direction of a physician by a qualified social worker holding a master's degree from an accredited school of social work, including assessment of the social, psychological, and family problems related to or arising out of the covered person's illness and treatment, appropriate action and utilization of community resources to assist in resolving the problems, and participation in the development of treatment for the covered person.

(16) "plan administrator" means an eligible entity that is licensed as a third-party administrator under AS 21.27 and is selected by the board and approved by the director to administer a state plan;

(17) "preexisting condition exclusion" has the meaning given in AS 21.54.500.

(18) "qualified TAA eligible individual" means a qualifying individual as defined under 26 U.S.C. 35, (Internal Revenue Code, as enacted by sec. 201(a) of the Trade Adjustment Assistance Reform Act of 2002).
