
Administrative Staff

- Claims processing; investigation; recommendations; process payments

Expenditures in FY2016

□ Medical expenses = 45% total payout

Negotiate all hospital bills over \$2,500

OTHER TYPES OF AWARDS

- Counseling
- Lost wages
- Loss of support in homicide cases
- Funeral expenses
- Relocation where safety or trauma is an issue
- Security measures
- Compensation for damaged property only where medically necessary or for safety reasons

FUNDING

- Two main sources of funds
 - Permanent fund dividend criminal funds appropriated to the Crime Victim Compensation Fund.
 - Victims Of Crime Act (Federal Funds).
- PFD criminal funds based on fluctuating annual PFD amount and no.
 of persons deemed ineligible during appropriate year
- Federal grant amount 60% of prior year expenditure to victims state funds only
- Each federal grant open for 4 years
 - FFY15 (\$390,000, expires 9/30/18)
 - FFY16 (\$575,000 expires 9/30/19)
- Receive modest amount of restitution, recoveries, reimbursements.
 - FY16 received \$73,000


FY 2018 Budget

FY18 budget request \$2.5m

- Funding Source:
 - \$1.5 Crime Victim Compensation Fund
 - \$1.0 Federal VOCA Funds
- Expenditures:
 - \$0.5 Administrative costs
 - \$2.0 Benefits to victims


FY2016 Statistics

- Received 861 new claims, 99% from Alaska residents
- □ Total paid out approximately \$1.6m

CHALLENGES

- 11
- FBI figures for 2015 report 730 violent crimes per 100,000 population (Uniform Crime Reporting) – therefore not reaching all victims of violent crime
- Application process can be lengthy and paper intensive
- National concern re co-operation and reporting requirements (for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault)
