STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation amends AS 18.60.270 to reduce the time allowed to file a boiler/pressure vessel inspection report from 30 days following an inspection to 15 days and establish a \$10 fee for insurers that do not file their inspection reports using the department's online system. The revenue generated from this fee will compensate the department for the data entry costs associated with reports that are not filed online.	_
Most companies already file online, however there are still some that file hard copies. Based on the average number of hard copy reports received annually, the department estimates that this fee will generate an additional \$32,000 per year to the building safety account. However, the fee may result in more reports filed using the online system.
