This proposed legislation amends AS 17.20 to include the labeling requirement of genetically modified (GMO) foo bill creates additional labeling and supplier verification recordkeeping requirements for processed food offered for sale, or requires that those who offer raw/unpeeled fruit or processed products for retail sale obtain statements use of genetic engineering in order to avoid labeling requirements.	or retail
Because this bill includes most food sold at retail (not just activities that require a permit to operate a food establ under Department of Environmental Conservation's regulations), the scope of the Department's regulated comm would expand significantly.	
As written, the fiscal impact to the Department cannot be determined at this time due to the immense scope of rentities that would be impacted and the resources that the Department would need in order to become prepared conduct outreach and inspection activities. With existing resources, the Department expects to be able to perforr retailer and processer outreach and education, labeling reviews, and respond to complaints. The Department wo be able to take enforcement action because the State lacks the analytical resources to conduct genetic testing to that a food product is in fact GMO.	d to m limited ould not
