## STATE OF ALASKA 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

## **Analysis**

HB 166 establishes a museum construction grant program in the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development. The department does not anticipate a fiscal impact until and unless legislative grant funding is appropriated. This bill intends to provide State matching grant funds for museum construction, expansion, and major renovation. Major renovation means a significant physical upgrade that allows a museum to better preserve artifacts and present artifacts to the public or improve space to allow a museum to provide improved education services to the public. Once funds are appropriated, the department anticipates a large number of applications which is indicated by the supporting documents to HB 166. In addition to the estimated 60 museums and cultural centers that are already in existence in 30 communities around the state, it is expected that numerous Alaska Native communities and tribes would be interested in applying for museum construction grants under the expanded definition of museum. The department will adopt regulations similar to those for the Public Library Construction and Expansion Grants Program. However, unlike the public library grants program the department will neither accept applications for a grant nor draft regulations unless the legislature first makes an appropriation for the grant program.
