My name is John E. Jensen, at this time I am seeking reappointment to the Alaska Board of Fisheries for the upcoming term; Fall 2017 – Spring 2020.

RESUME

I was born in 1951, in Petersburg, Alaska. I graduated from Petersburg High School in 1969.

My commercial fishing career began in earnest in 1965, with long-lining for halibut in the Gulf of Alaska and summer salmon seining with my uncle Gordon Jensen and father, Bernard, aboard the F/V Symphony. Following graduation, my fishing opportunities quickly expanded from salmon and halibut, to the empire building years of red king and tanner crab fishing in the Bering Sea in the late 1960's and early '70's.

In 1971, I attended college for two years, followed by the purchase of the first of five, commercial fishing vessels. My first vessel was used in the SE AK salmon gillnet fishery.

In 1972, I married my wife Pam, and we have two sons, both are now 4th generation, commercial fishermen.

During my fifty adventurous years at sea, I have participated in seven different regions and over twenty fisheries all across Alaska. I have gained an in-depth knowledge and a wealth of experience, in commercial fishing in all of the following areas, fisheries and gear types:

Salmon: Southeast, Bristol Bay, and the Alaska Peninsula; gillnet and seine.

Herring: Southeast, Bristol Bay, Cook Inlet, Norton Sound; gillnet, roe on kelp, and seine.

Tanner Crab: Southeast, Gulf of Alaska, Bering Sea/Aleutians

Red King Crab: Southeast, Bering Sea/Aleutians

Brown King Crab: Southeast

Halibut & Black Cod: Southeast, Gulf of Alaska

Dungeness Crab: Southeast

I attended Merchant Marine Training Services and acquired my Master 100 GT and Assistance Towing license. When I was not commercial fishing I skippered numerous 75' - 135' vessels for fish tendering in various fisheries and areas of Alaska.

A serious interest in fish politics began with serving on the Petersburg Fish & Game Advisory Committee in the 1970's. In 2002, I eagerly accepted an appointment to the Alaska Board of Fisheries and have completed four terms. I am currently serving in my fifth term. This year, 2016, I have been elected Chairman of the Board.

As a member of the Board of Fisheries I have served on many liaison committees: Red King and Tanner Task Force, Petersburg Sea Otter Work Group, Joint Protocol, Salmon Restructuring Panel and the State Waters Pollock Committee; just to name a few. In 2014, I was appointed by Governor Parnell to be a member of the North Pacific Anadromous Fish Commission. In 2016, my committee and task force assignments include work on the Federal/State Subsistence, and chair of the Joint BOF/NPFMC Protocol and Legislation.

Other life-long interests include raising my family, hunting and sport fishing, wood-working and building construction, and as an avid reader – I especially enjoy reading Alaskan history.

I have assumed an active role in a variety of other local and public service positions:

Petersburg Planning and Zoning Commission - member for 8 years

Petersburg City Council – member for 2 years

Thomas Bay Power Authority - board member for 8 years

Southeast Alaska Power Authority – board member for 8 years and am currently serving as chairman

In my semi-retirement years, I now own and operate a small skiff rental business in Petersburg. We provide clients with skiffs to take part in local, self-guided, sport fishing and hunting, camping, wild-life and glacier viewing expeditions. I am still active in the Southeast commercial fisheries of halibut and tanner crab.

My primary goal in serving on the Alaska Board of Fisheries has been and would continue to be, working effectively to help maintain sustainable fish populations for all Alaskans.
