A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- "An Act establishing the Alaska education innovation grant program; eliminating the
 Alaska education grant program and the Alaska performance scholarship program;
- 3 redesignating the Alaska higher education investment fund as the Alaska education
- 4 innovation grant fund; and providing for an effective date."

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
