FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill requires nonresidents to be accompanied by a guide or resident relative within the second degree of kindred when hunting Porcupine, Central Arctic, or Western Arctic caribou herds.

There are no additional costs associated with these changes as the division currently manages other hunts with the same requirements. The affidavit system already exists to manage the additional requirements.

The Board of Game will need to promulgate regulations that specify in which Game Management Units there will be a requirement for nonresident caribou hunters to be accompanied by a person qualified under the terms of AS 16.05.407(a).
