BILL NO. HB 211

Analysis

This legislation amends AS 16.05.407 by adding a new subsection (g) adding certain caribou to the types of big game animals that require a nonresident to be accompanied by a guide or resident spouse or relative when hunting such animals, and making a violation of the new subsection a misdemeanor.

Passage of this legislation is not expected to have a significant impact on the enforcement efforts of the Alaska Wildlife Troopers. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
