FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

BILL NO. HB 224

Analysis

This bill will allow retired teachers who retired with a normal retirement benefit to return to participating positions in the Teachers' Retirement System to work full or part-time and still receive their TRS benefit. Retired teachers must have a bona fide termination of employment with retirees age 62 or older required to separate from employment for a minimum of 3 months and retirees under age 62 are required to separate from employment for 12 months.

An actuarial analysis performed by the Plan actuary will need to be completed to determine the actual costs of the bill and the effects on future unfunded liability. Therefore, this fiscal note is indeterminate at this time.

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
