FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill requires the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) to include in the minimum criminal justice curriculum requirements for police officers, probation officers, and correctional officers training in recognizing people with disabilities, appropriate interactions with persons with disabilities, resources available to persons with disabilities and to those interacting with persons with disabilities, and on the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

This bill also requires the Department of Administration's Division of Motor Vehicles to provide a method for a person to designate voluntarily on an identification card or driver's license that the person has a disability, and to include the duties and responsibilities of drivers when encountering or being stopped by a peace officer in its driver's license examination and Alaska driver manual.

This bill would have no fiscal impact on the Alaska Police Standards Council.
