Alaska Criminal Justice Commission					Adds a non-voting member (HSS) to the Alaska Criminal Justice Commission.
Electronic Monitoring					Clarifies that a person may not serve on electronic monitoring post-conviction and pre-sentencing.
Mental States					Changes the mental state (from knowingly to w/ criminal negligence) required to convict a person of riding in a stolen car, which is criminal mischief in the 5th degree.
Early Discharge					Increases the length of time a non-sex, non-DV, class C felony probationer must serve on probation before discharge, from 1 year to 18 months, despite having zero probation violations and having completed all required treatment programs.

- Other Problems:
- The immediate effective date of the bill is problematic to a number of agencies.
  - No direct court rule change to bail schedule change.
