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Sponsor Statement

SB 28 - Municipal Land Selections for the Petersburg Borough

Senate Bill 28 will set the total general land entitlement for the Petersburg Borough (Borough) at 14,666 acres. This is an increase of 12,770 acres from its current level of entitlement, and would bring the Borough's land entitlement to a level similar to the other eighteen organized boroughs in the state. SB 28 will address the long-term economic sustainability of a recently formed borough.

When the Borough formed in 2013, it received a general land grant entitlement from the state of 1,896 acres. Of the 1,896 acres, 457.47 acres had already been given to the City of Petersburg. A substantial part of the 457.47 acres is restricted to public, charitable, or recreational use.

After deducting the 457.47 acres that went to the City, the Borough's land entitlement is 1,438.53 acres which is an area roughly 1/3rd the size of the Anchorage International Airport. 1,438.53 acres simply does not provide enough land to support economic development such as rock and sand material sites for roads, airports, waterfront land for tourism development, or residential homes.

The Borough would select the additional 12,770 acres from seven different areas around the Borough. All selections would be made from vacant, unappropriated, and unreserved state lands. No selections would interfere with existing State, University, or Alaska Mental Health Trust lands, including the Southeast State Forest, or private ownership.

The Petersburg Borough recognizes we are in difficult budget times. An increased land base is critical for the Petersburg Borough to become more self-sufficient.

A patent shall be issued to the municipality for land selected in satisfaction of a general grant land entitlement vested under AS 29.65.010 - 29.65.030 within three months after approval by the director of a plat of survey.

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Sectional Analysis


SB 28 - "An Act relating to the general grant land entitlement for the Petersburg Borough; and providing for an effective date."

SECTION 1 Adds a new paragraph to AS 29.65.010(a) for a general grant land entitlement for Petersburg Borough.

SECTION 2 Amends AS 29.65.040(c) to state that land may be selected or nominated for the general grant land entitlement created in sec. 1 of this bill any time before October 1, 2018.

Adds the Petersburg Borough general grant land entitlement to an exception under AS 29.65.050(c) that allows the director of lands, Department of Natural Resources, to approve a selection that would otherwise be disapproved if the director determines that the public interest can be adequately protected by issuing a patent that is subject to stipulations, conditions, or covenants, and the municipality agrees to them.



Petersburg Borough **ADL 104903** VUU LAND









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Petersburg Borough






We, the Petersburg Borough Assembly, are writing to request introduction of legislation seeking an increase in the general land grant entitlement to the Petersburg Borough.

According to ADNR, there are approximately 18,324 acres of state-owned VUU (vacant, unappropriated, unreserved) land within the Petersburg Borough that qualifies for selection under the Municipal Entitlement program. Of this, the borough land entitlement is 1,374 acres or approximately .07% of the borough's land area.

While the state owned a great deal of land within the borough at one time, most has been re-conveyed to other agencies such as the Alaska Mental Health Trust, the University of Alaska, and Southeast State Forest leaving little for the new borough to select to meet its future planning and economic development goals. Moreover, the majority of these lands were either valuable waterfront property or forested land, leaving primarily inaccessible and undevelopable lands in the borough's entitlement selection pool.

Petersburg would not be setting a precedent by seeking an increased land grant, in fact, quite the opposite. We note 14 of the 18 boroughs in Alaska prior to Petersburg Borough formation obtained general grant land entitlements through the legislative process. On average, Alaska's boroughs have received .79% of their land base in entitlement lands. If Petersburg Borough were to receive the "average", the entitlement would amount to over 14,600 acres (based on current estimate of VUU land within the borough).

The land entitlement program was created expressly for the development needs of the new borough and to address the economic, cultural and resource-based goals of its residents. The borough is seeking the increased land grant to provide for, among other things:

- a wetlands mitigation bank to meet Army Corps of Engineers compensatory mitigation requirements for future development;
- o new sources of rock/sand for road and development projects;
- amenity/waterfront land for tourism development or settlement to increase local property and sales tax revenue; and
- o Land suitable for commercial/industrial development.

In the very near future, it will be necessary for municipalities to fund more of their operations and rely less on state and federal monies. An increased land base is a critical component if the Petersburg Borough is to become more self-sufficient.
