

Seizure Authorized



Court must find there's a substantial probability that:

- 1. The property is subject to forfeiture
- 2. The state will likely prevail, and
- 3. It is likely that the property will be destroyed or removed without the court order.

The need to preserve the property does not outweigh the hardship to the owner or other interest holder.




The seizure is incident to a lawful arrest or search warrant and:

- The officer has probable cause to believe that the property is subject to forfeiture and the person arrested is the owner of the property.
- 2. The property is subject to a previous judgment
- The officer has probable cause to believe that the property is subject to forfeiture and the officer has reason to believe that the property will be destroyed.

The officer is required to issue an itemized receipt of all items seized.
