Chairman Birch and Senate Resources Committee Members,

I was astounded to learn of Governor Dunleavy's nomination of Jason Brune to head the Department of Environmental Conservation and urge you to vote against his confirmation. In his positions as Public Relations and Governmental Affairs for multinational mining company Anglo American and as Executive Director of the Resource Development Council, Mr. Brune has promoted the development of the Pebble Prospect without reservation.
