BILL NO. SB3

Analysis

This legislation will establish a middle college program at the University of Alaska (University). Public school students who have completed 10th grade and have not graduated will be eligible to earn both high school and college credit for courses as allowed by the University. It also allows the public school to receive an Average Daily Membership (ADM) for qualifying students to be used to cover University tuition costs. Other fees, including books and transportation are the responsibility of the student.
This legislation amends the reporting requirements of the State Board of Education and Early Development to include data on the middle college program, and amends the general powers and duties of the University to allow for agreements with local school districts to carry out the middle college program. There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Education & Early Development.
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
