This bill classifies knowingly causing a person to become unconscious by means of a dangerous instrument as assault in the first degree (class A felony). It also adds masturbating in the presence of another person and ejaculating on that person without consent to the crime of sexual assault in the third degree (class C felony). When the offender is the victim's natural parent, residing in the same household, or occupies a position of authority and that person masturbates in the presence of a person who is under the age of 18 and ejaculates on that person, the bill classifies that conduct as sexual abuse of a minor in the third degree (class C felony). It would also be sexual abuse of a minor in the third degree if the offender masturbates in the presence of a person who is under 16 years of age, at least 3 years younger than the offender, and the offender ejaculates on that person.
Finally, the bill prohibits a court from granting credit towards a person's sentence for time spent in a treatment program or on electronic monitoring before trial if the person is being sentenced for a sex offense.
The Department of Law does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.
