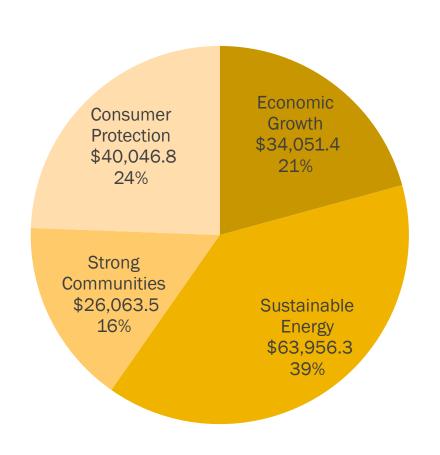

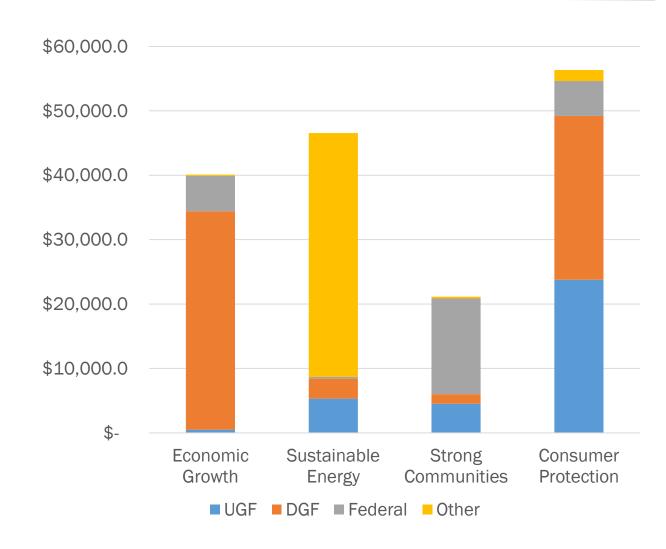

### DCCED FY2020 Operating Budget: Total by Priority Program



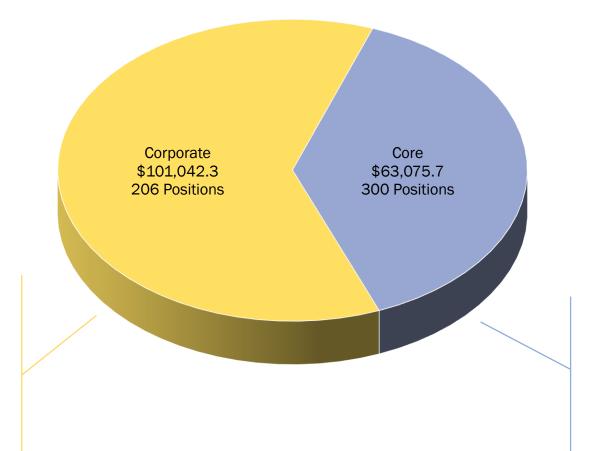

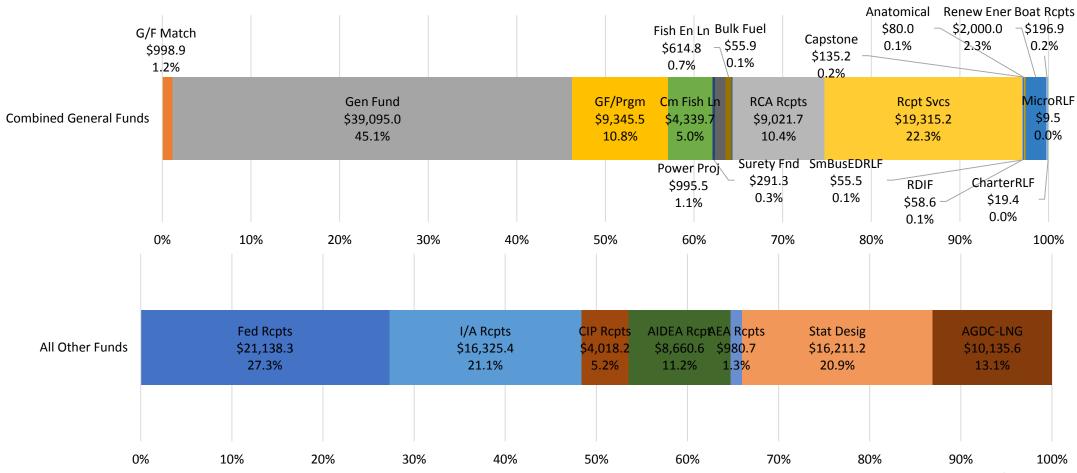

#### DCCED FY2020 Operating Budget: Fund Source Breakdown by Fund Category





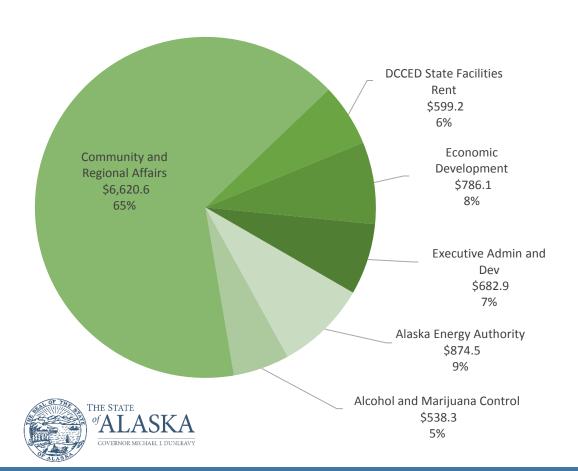

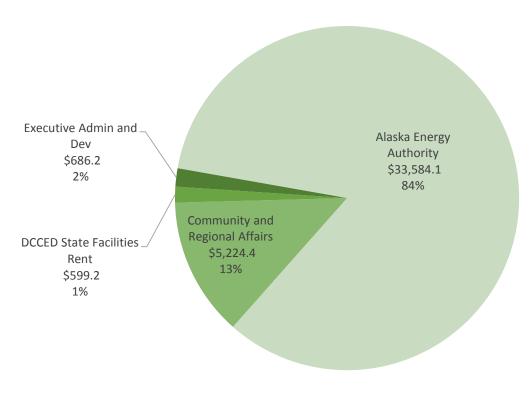

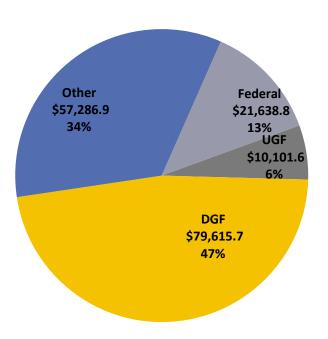




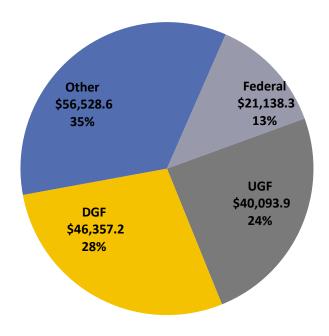
#### DCCED FY2020 Operating Budget: Fiscal Year Comparison and Lapse

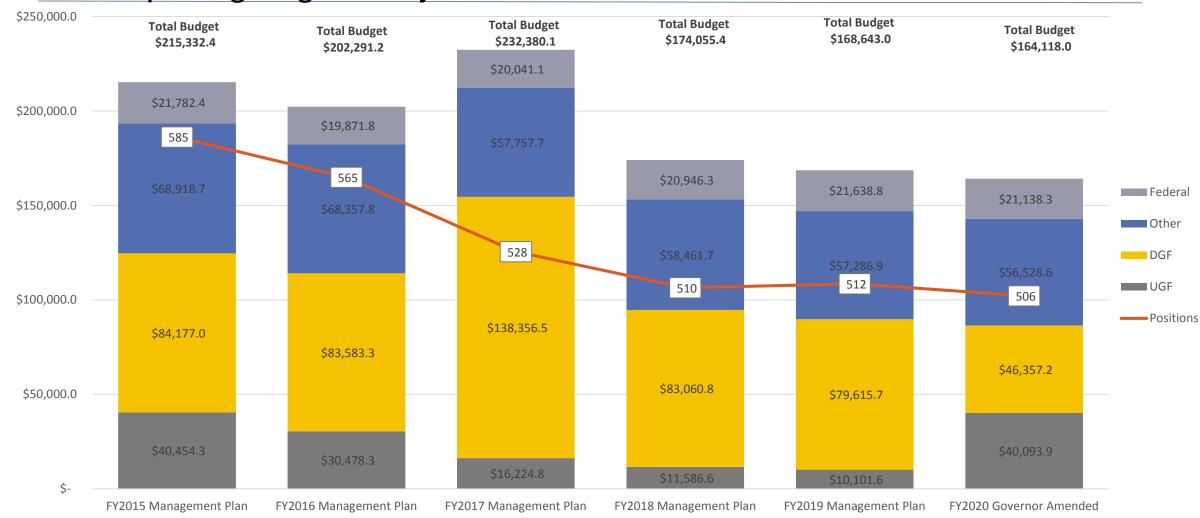

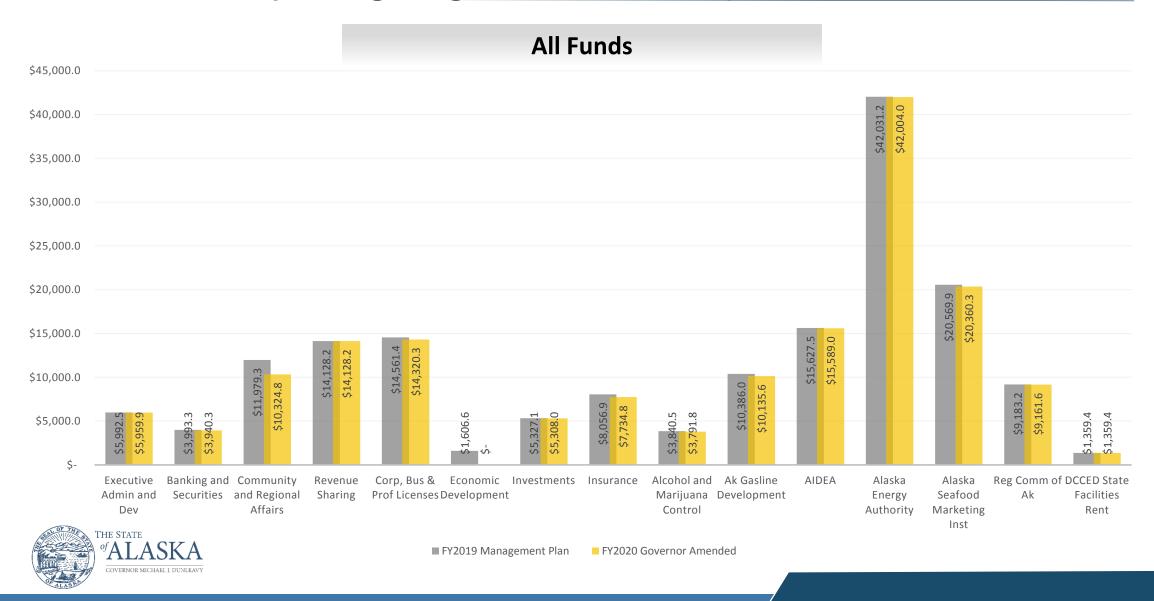

#### **Statewide Rates and Changes**

- Rates charged to DCCED by other departments vary year to year
- Budgetary and programmatic changes in DCCED or the charging department can cause rate changes
  - PCN additions / deletions / vacancies in either agency can result in changes to PCN-driven rates
  - Changes in space needs (consolidated footprint, paperless initiatives, position count changes) can result in changes to space costs
  - Cost savings in DCCED (e.g. reduced footprint) can result in DCCED savings but increased costs to all other agencies as DCCED's portion of statewide payments goes down (e.g. lease administration fee to SSOA)
  - Reductions of UGF or other funding in the charging agency can increase costs to DCCED
- Some rates for FY2019 are still in progress
- Rate amounts for FY2020 are not yet known
- Administrative Services and Commissioner's Office charge internal rates to divisions
- No changes in DCCED's FY2020 budget related to rates
