FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill adds provisions to AS 18.65.850 and AS 18.66.100 to prevent the court from denying a protective order solely on the basis that a prior protective order had been issued, even if no new incident of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking has occurred. The bill also allows a long-term protective order to be extended at the request of the petitioner.	
In accordance with AS 18.65.540 the Department of Public Safety maintains the central registry of protective orders which is part of the Alaska Public Safety Information Network (APSIN). Law enforcement enters information relating to new, modified, or dismissed protective orders in the central registry. This information is accessible by law enforcement officers across the state to confirm the existence of such orders and verify the provisions of the order in order to enforce any violations of the order. Violation of a protective order is a class A misdemeanor under AS 11.56.740.	
The Alaska State Troopers routinely update protective orders in the central registry as new information is received from the court. Passage of this bill will not have an impact on that process. Therefore, a zero fiscal note is being submitted.
