Analysis

This legislation creates a new class A felony, punishable by up to twenty years of incarceration for causing another to become unconscious using hands or another object to impede breathing. The bill creates several new class C felonies, punishable by up to five years of incarceration related to masturbation. The bill also enables an increase to the sentence imposed based on a new aggravator where one knowingly caused another to become unconscious by use of a dangerous instrument.
The Agency cannot predict the number of new cases that may be charged as a result of this legislation or whether those charged would be appointed a public defender. Therefore, The Office of Public Advocacy submits an indeterminate fiscal note subject to review of estimates from the Department of Law on potential caseload increases.
