

DPS FY2020 Operating Budget: Fund Source Breakdown by Fund Category






DPS FY2020 Operating Budget: Fiscal Year Comparison







DPS FY2020 Operating Budget: Fiscal Year Comparison

DPS FY2020 Operating Budget: Change Summary

- Program reform
 - Federal designation as a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) - \$5,000.0 federal receipt authority to combat Alaska's opioid epidemic through coordinated law enforcement strategies and intelligence sharing
- Maximizing return on assets
 - Taking full advantage of federal assistance to address Alaska's high rates of domestic violence and sexual assault \$4,000.0 federal receipt authority
 - Increased federal formula award for Coverdell and DNA Capacity Enhancement grant programs to improve quality and timeliness of forensic science services and eliminate backlogs in evidence analysis \$150.0 federal receipt authority

- User pay
 - Increase collections from non-state law enforcement agencies sending recruits to the DPS Training Academy \$150.0 general fund program receipt authority, \$500.0 interagency receipt authority

Statewide Impact

- DPS is Alaska's primary statewide law enforcement agency
- Direct support to other agencies
 - Investigative assistance
 - Search and rescue
 - Training
 - Alaska Public Safety Information Network
 - Crime lab

DPS FY2020 Operating Budget: Metrics, Outcomes, Best Practices

- Fire & Life Safety conducted 845 building inspections and 825 building plan reviews in FY2018
- Bureau of Judicial Services 8,110 warrants and 1,629 domestic violence orders served in FY2018
- Statewide Drug and Alcohol Enforcement Unit – CY2017 seizures included 221 pounds of methamphetamine (five times the amount seized in CY2016) and 82 pounds of heroin (three times the amount seized in CY2016)

- **AST Detachments** handled over 90,000 calls for service and responded to over 3,400 vehicle collisions, and 750 search and rescue incidents in FY2018
- Training Academy Recent recruitment efforts have resulted in an Academy class of 18 state trooper recruits
- Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault supported 20 victim service programs across the state assisting over 3,000 individuals in FY2018

Village Public Safety Officer Program

- Ten grantees (one borough and nine nonprofit regional corporations)
- Program began in 1979 to provide public safety services to rural communities
- Created to reduce loss of life due to fires, drowning, lost person, and lack of immediate emergency medical assistance in rural communities

- Recruit training for state and municipal law enforcement agencies and VPSOs
- In-service training covering refresher, update, and advanced topics
- Public safety training to other government agencies

Alaska Fire Standards Council

- Establish professional standards for fire service personnel
- Establish curriculum requirements for the certification of training programs
- Govern the procedure for certification of individuals who satisfy the minimum training and performance standards

Alaska Police Standards Council

- In cases of misconduct by a certified police officer, make a determination whether certification should be revoked
- Develop, monitor, and revise law enforcement training
- Assist academies and departments with funding for academy training
- Fund specialized and advanced training for departments
- Determine certification eligibility for all police, probation, and correctional officers and issue appropriate level of certificate

Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault

 Provide safety for Alaskans victimized or impacted by domestic violence and sexual assault through a system of statewide crisis intervention, prevention services, and perpetrator accountability
