



Recipients of the APA, ATAP, GA, HAP, IA, ME, SB, SNAP and WIC programs.







#### **Applications received**





Applications are new applications for benefits received during the month.

### Work completed



Work completed is case determinations made (applications and renewals approved or denied) during the month.

#### **Public Assistance Programs**

APA Adult Public Assistance Gives monthly cash payments and medical assistance to eligible elderly, blind, and disabled persons.

Alaska Temporary Assistance Program Gives monthly cash payments to eligible families with children.

GA General Relief Assistance Helps eligible individuals and families with emergency rent and utility needs. Also helps with burial costs.

Heating Assistance Program Helps eligible households defray their winter heating costs by
 issuing an annual grant to their vendor. The State administration of HAP covers 58.7% of the state with the remainder served by tribal providers.

IA Interim Assistance Provides monetary assistance on a month-by-month basis to eligible individuals undergoing temporary diffculties or one-time needs.

ME Medicaid Offers medical coverage to eligible low-income Alaskans. Also helps with Medicare Parts A and B premiums.

**SB** Senior Benefits Gives monthly cash payments to eligible low-income seniors.

SNAP Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Helps people buy food.

WIC Women, Infants and Children Provides nutrition education, breastfeeding support and cash payments for supplemental food to eligible women and young children.
