

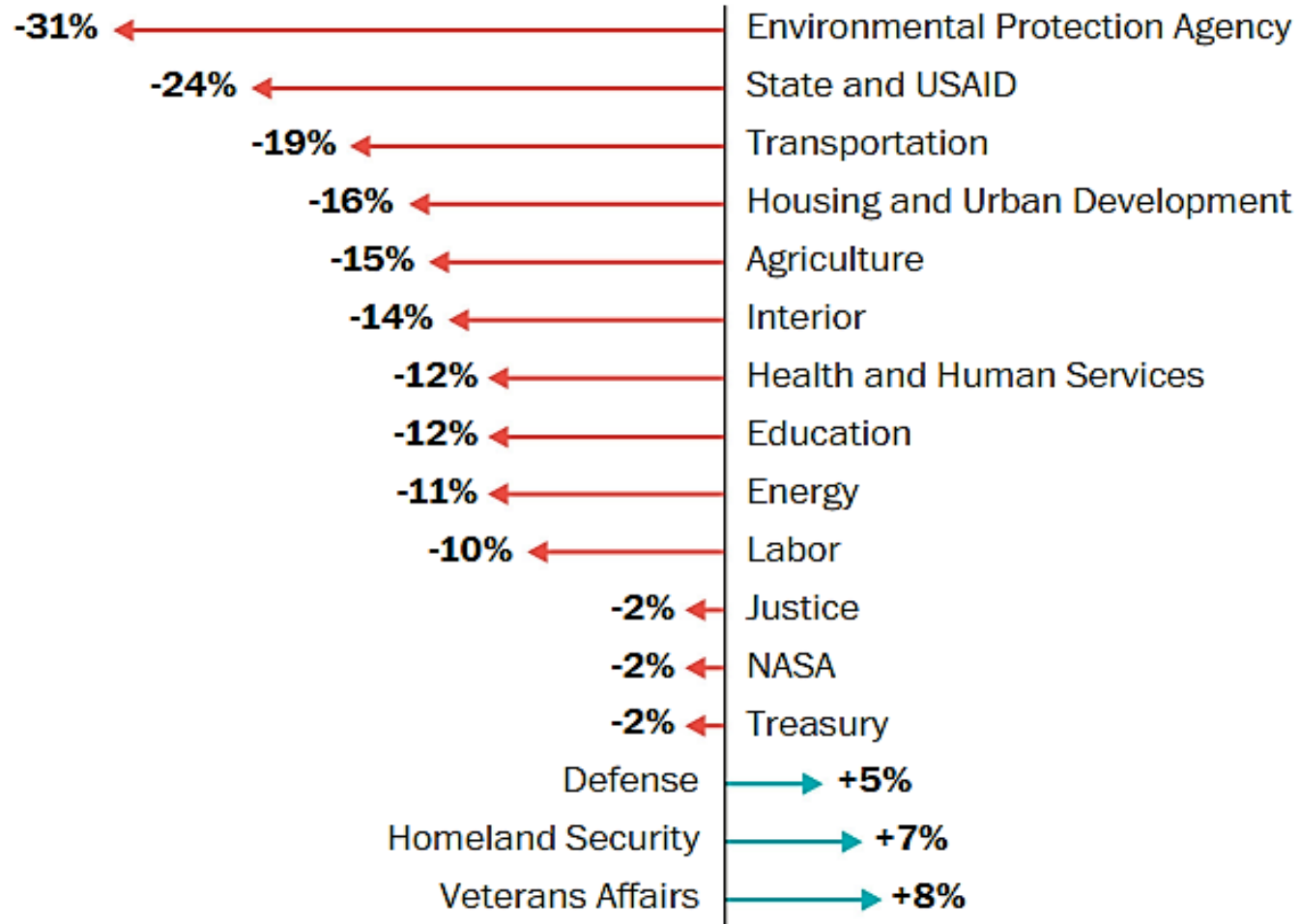


Alaska's Tribal Housing Needs

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Proposed changes to funding in Trump's budget



FYI 2020 President's Proposed Budget

- Non Discretionary Defense Down \$69 Billion
- 11% after adjusting for inflation
- BIA/BIE down 10.5 %
- HUD down 16%

- NCAI and NAIHC's recommended Funding the Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG) at \$932 million but not less than \$755 million.
- Block grant funds for housing development, construction, infrastructure, maintenance, repair in tribal communities and to leverage other funds, such as low-income housing tax credits.
- IHBG has been level funded since creation in 1996. It would be nearly \$1 billion if funding had kept pace with inflation.

AAHA State Legislative Priorities –FY 2020

Priority #1: Strongly supports the AHFC Supplemental Housing Development Grant (SHDG) in the amount of \$3 million in the FY2020 Capital Budget

- Is 20% match for development, will leverage at least \$12 million in additional private and federal funding, a minimum return of 4:1
- The return on the state's investment regularly exceeds 5X the funding amount.

AAHA State Legislative Priorities -FY 2020

Priority #2: Support Census count in Alaska and that the Alaska Complete Count Commission is endorsed

- Federal funds are formula based from Census Data
- Alaska has historically had a documented significant undercount.

AAHA State Legislative Priorities -FY 2020

Priority #3: Strongly supports the AHFC Weatherization Program in the amount of \$5 million in the FY2020 Capital Budget

- Reduces energy bills, improving and preserving housing stock, reducing housing stock that is unsafe from carbon dioxide, mold and other health risks
- Creating jobs, and boosting struggling local economies .

AAHA State Legislative Priorities -FY 2020

Priority #4: Strongly supports the AHFC Senior Citizens Housing Development Grant Program (SCHDGP) for \$1.75 million in the FY2020 Capital Budget

- Development of housing for the fastest growing population of Alaska, our senior citizens
- Provide leveraging for approximately three development projects or 30 new senior housing units for low- and middle-income seniors

AAHA State Legislative Priorities -FY 2020

Priority #5: Strongly supports the AHFC Teacher, Health Professional, and Public Safety Housing Grant Program for \$1.75 million in the FY2020 Capital Budget

- Require at least a 20% match with other sources of funding, leveraging their impact 5X above the State of Alaska funding level
- The Teacher, Health Professional and Public Safety Housing Grant Program allows small communities in Alaska to recruit and retain teachers, health and public safety professionals

Alaska RHA's statewide economic impact for 2016:

- Bring annual funding of ~\$94M in federal funding from HUD to invest in preservation of existing housing and construction of new housing
- Generated approximately \$193 million direct & indirect statewide economic activity by leveraging federal funding with other public, private, federal and state funding
- Employed approximately 1,400 individuals
- Constructed 125 affordable and highly energy-efficient homes
- Weatherized 100 homes
- Rehabilitated or renovated 500 homes



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
