



FY18 Workload Analysis & Comparison with Budgeted Positions





FY19 Workload Analysis & Comparison with Budgeted Positions





PDA Challenges

Workload Increases

- Trial workload increased 10% since FY17
 - Misdemeanors have increased 50% since FY17
 - Felonies have increased 28% since FY17
- Trial caseload is beyond maximum ethical limit set by the American Bar Association

Meeting Constitutional Obligations

Reduced resources impact ability to:

- Meet Court of Appeals filing deadlines
- Maintain effective presence in rural offices necessary to meet ethical and constitutional obligations

Recruitment

- Vacancies increase backlog and workload, and decrease the effectiveness of efficiency initiatives
- Retention is impacted by sustained workload increases and budget restraints on relief strategies.

PDA Accomplishments

- Expanding Holistic Justice Initiative, designed to assist clients with non-legal barriers to successful re-entry, utilizing lower-cost, non-attorney staff & volunteers
- Implementation of new web-based case management system
- Initiated technology upgrades to increase mobility and full utilization of webbased case management and digital files.
- Continuing to address appellate backlog while meeting new Court of Appeals filing deadlines
- Cost reductions from held vacancies, service RFPs, employee furloughs, teleconferencing
