## Senator Bishop;

The Petersburg Borough is an Alaskan community that prides itself on managing our own needs. The Fisheries Business Tax makes this possible, and Senate Bill 63 is contrary to this philosophy.

The Borough has received over \$13.5M in Fisheries Business tax receipts over the last 19 years. This averages over \$711,000 a year that is generated by our fisherman, through our local processing companies. These funds created in our Borough are used to maintain and upgrade the very infrastructure needed by the Community to support the industry itself. This includes the Harbors, Emergency Services, our Library, Schools, and Parks & Recreation facilities. Our fisherman pride themselves on bringing their catches back to the community where their hard work can be used to make their homes a better place for themselves and their families. In short, the program works.

Senate Bill 63 takes this away. If this Bill is signed into law, the Petersburg Borough will be forced to raise taxes and moorage rates.
