


#### **Budget Changes: Facilities Services (\$ Thousands)**

- Receipt Authority to Allow Collection of Revenue for Facilities Maintenance and Operations (\$42,000.0 Inter-agency Receipts)
- Executive Branch 50% Travel Reduction (-\$1.2 Inter-agency Receipts; -\$15.0 CIP)
- Transfer Maintenance & Facilities Support Staff from Department of Labor and Workforce Development, AVTEC Facilities Management (5 Permanent Full-Time; 1 Permanent Part-Time)





## Facilities Initiative — Benefits

#### Unity of Purpose, Values, and Abilities

- Uniting facilities maintenance personnel knowledge, resources and expertise
  - Utilizing the expertise across the state.
  - Maximizing efficiency and available resources, minimizing duplication.
- Facilities maintenance, design and construction under one Division
  - Holistic view of deferred maintenance and facilities needs statewide across all agencies.



## Facilities Initiative — Progress

Statewide Public Facilities brought into DFS – October 2017

- FY19 (July 1, 2018):
  - All DOT&PF regional facilities M&O personnel brought in
  - 30 facilities personnel from DOA and DEED transferred into DFS
  - Combination of 102 Statewide Maintenance Professionals in DFS
- Service Levels Agreements (SLAs)
  - 2018: SLA's in-place with DOT&PF, DOA and DEED
  - 2019: Goal SLA's executed with HSS, DOL&WD and DPS
  - 2020: Goal SLA's executed with DF&G, DEC, DNR and DMVA
     (All SLAs updated each FY)

## Facilities Initiative — Expansion

- Statewide Expansion to all agencies:
  - Following the OMB approved expansion plan August 2018
- CMMS Implementation / Facilities Condition Assessments (FCIs) future deployments
- Discoveries:
  - Standardizing operational and administrative processes.
  - Balancing resources and growing capability.
  - Determining overall facilities personnel and facilities to be included as we work with the other agencies.
  - Refining charge-back methodology and details.

- DFS now leading implementation of new enterprise-wide system




#### Statewide SCADA Implementation to monitor facilities





- Objective assessment and uniform analysis of existing conditions and DM needs.
- Structured, consistent and predictable means of prioritizing and selecting DM projects.
- Results based, measurable Key
   Performance Indicators and reporting
   to show progress on project execution,
   facility improvement and return on
   investment.







- The State's vertical design and construction authority for new facilities, deferred maintenance and energy efficiency projects
  - Total Capital & DM Projects: 105
  - Total Budget of Projects: \$185M
