This bill creates new theft crimes by expanding the current definitions of theft in the second degree and fraudulent use of access devices, both class C felonies. This bill also creates a new misdemeanor for the possession of "vehicle theft tools."
The Office of Public Advocacy cannot predict the number of new cases that may be charged as a result of this legislation or whether those charged would be referred to the Office of Public Advocacy. The Office of Public Advocacy, therefore, submits an indeterminate fiscal note subject to review of estimates from the Department of Law on potential caseload increases.
