Analysis

This legislation requires coordination between the Department of Corrections (DOC) and the Department of Labor and Workforce Development (DOLWD) to provide offender access to job training and employment assistance programs after release. DOLWD already coordinates with DOC to provide these services. There is no fiscal impact to DOLWD as a result of this legislation.
