Alaska had universal vaccine coverage for over 30 years with federal funds secured by Sen. Ted Stevens

2009

- Changed when Sen. Stevens was not re-elected Meningicoccol
 State supplied to the second sec
- State supplied pediatric HPV and MCV4 vaccines discontinued for non-VFC eligible (VFC means the "Vaccine for Children's" program)

2011

· State supplied adult vaccines discontinued

2012

- Pneumococcal
 State supplied pediatric influenza, PCV13, and rotavirus vaccines discontinued for non-VFC eligible
- \$4.5 million/year from Senator Giessel's SB144/HB 310 (HB310 passed CH 24 SLA 2012)
 - 3-year stopgap measure
 - recommended vaccines to underinsured kids (not including HPV)
 - Select vaccines for un/underinsured adults
- \$700.0/year in FY 2013 Governor's budget to support immunization purchase

2013

Providers need to buy vaccine for insured kids starting January 1, 2013

2014

- Senator Giessel's SB169 passed creating the Vaccine Assessment Program
 - Restored universal access for children and adults
 - Vaccine Assessment Account seed money came from final year of HB310 funding

2015

AK Vaccine Assessment Program begins Jan. 1, 2015

2019

 SB37 introduced to remove repealers (sunset) from the AVAP statutes so it will become a permanent program, requiring no general funds
