
By default, the Alaska Department of Corrections is the state's largest provider of mental health services in the state.

Mental Health Needs Continue to Stress the System

In FY18, mental health services had 17,509 total contacts with offenders.

Includes formal mental health consultations; does not include offenders served in groups, segregation wellness checks or responses to offender written requests.

Mental health contacts have increased 61% in the past 8 years.

Substance Abuse Treatment

The Alaska Department of Corrections is also the state's largest substance abuse treatment provider and provides the most drug and alcohol detoxification services.

Medication Assisted Treatment for Reentry (MATR)

Extended release injectable naltrexone (Vivitrol) to highly motivated offenders who are nearing release.

To reduce cravings for and block the effects of ingested opioids. Includes Screening and Brief Intervention (SBIRT) along with psychoeducation.

Includes coordination of care to a community provider for follow up injections and counseling post release.

Open access to both sentenced and unsentenced offenders.

114 injections were given in FY18.

Sex Offender Management


Alaska has the highest rate of sexual assault in the country.

Offenders convicted of sexual crimes make up 15.3% of Alaska's total prisoner population—about 725 inmates on any given day.




