FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. SB 123

Analysis

SB 123 gives the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) functions pertaining to electric reliability organizations, including its ability to form an electric reliability organization (ERO) if the RCA determines no person has applied for a certification of an ERO. SB 123 provides a funding mechanism for, and the composition of, the governing board of an ERO.
SB 123 addresses how an ERO will develop and submit reliability standard to the RCA. It also provides an avenue to allow the RCA to require a reliability standard to be developed or modified.
A certificated ERO under the proposed statute will be able to impose a penalty on a user, owner, or operator of an interconnected bulk-power system for violation of a reliability standard. The penalty can be appealed to the RCA.
After certification, an ERO will be required to develop and file a plan for meeting the reliability requirements of customers within its interconnected bulk-power system in the most cost-effective manner, consistent with the load-serving entities' obligations.
SB 123 provides the RCA with siting authority for large energy facilities.
The RCA currently expects to implement the provisions of this legislation with existing resources, and does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
