BILL NO. SB 169

Analysis

This bill would make changes in statutes relating to the operations of the Alaska State Council on the Arts. These include changes related to legal representation for the council.

This bill would clarify that the Department of Law provides legal counsel to the council and authorizes the council to retain additional counsel as appropriate at the discretion of the board of trustees. As the Department of Law currently provides legal representation to the State Council on the Arts, the department does not anticipate any fiscal impact if this bill becomes law.
