Accreditation Overview



Accreditation

Accreditation

- o Status a recognized accrediting agency grants to an institution or educational program
- o Institution or program meets the agencies qualifying requirements and accreditation criteria
- o Process involves initial and periodic self-evaluation followed by an evaluation by peers
- Awarded by a non-governmental agency recognized by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education
- o Provides a professional judgment regarding the quality of the educational institution or program offered and to encourage continual institutional improvement

Types of Accreditation

- o Regional institutions within a prescribed geographic region (UAA, UAF, UAS)
- o National institutions that are single purpose in nature (does not apply to UA)
- o Program/Specialized unit (school, department, program or curriculum) within an institution
- The Board of Regents Academic and Student Affairs Committee receives an update from each university at its quarterly meeting and the Board receives an annual written report on accreditation status in September

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Accreditation

- Institutional Accreditation from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
 - UAA, UAF and UAS are all in good standing
 - Seven year review cycle.
 - UAA: Site visit and evaluation in 2018, Accreditation reaffirmed in January 2019. Next site visit 2025.
 - UAS: Site visit and Accreditation reaffirmed in 2019. Next site visit in 2026.
 - UAF: Site visit and evaluation in September 2020 (postponed from 2019). Accreditation reaffirmation expected in 2021.
 - Program and Specialized Accreditation
 - UA has over 60 program/specialized accreditations across the system
 - Examples of accrediting organizations:
 - Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET)
 - Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB)
 - Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP)
 - Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN)

Teacher Education Update



UA Teacher Education Programs

- UAA's loss of CAEP accreditation for its initial licensure teacher preparation programs required University and Board action to meet student needs
- The only certain path for UA education graduates to state licensure from an approved and accredited program was for UAF and UAS to step in to provide programs after August 2019
- The Board of Regents approved the discontinuation of UAA programs and accepted the modified UAF and UAS proposals to meet student needs. These decisions were implemented such that Southcentral students were offered several options beginning in Fall 2019 to pursue teaching degrees that would lead to state licensure

April 2019 Board of Regents votes to discontinue initial

licensure programs

August 2019 UAS and UAF recruit students in Southcentral Alaska

into teacher education programs. UAF begins to



UA Teachers are Well Prepared

- Each spring the different UA education units survey the principals of the schools where the new UA prepared teachers are working
- Feedback from the principals on the new UA prepared teachers is positive
- The Network for Excellence in Teaching (NExT) Survey (based at North Dakota State) used for this is a nationally validated and administered across the country. Alaska is one of four states where all the EPPs use NExT Survey.

University of Alaska Supporting Recruitment and Retention of Alaska's K-12 Teachers

Alaska Statewide Mentoring Project – mentors are working in 26 districts with 150 Early Career Teachers

Educators Rising Alaska- activity in 35 districts, more than 100 students attend annual conference in Fairbanks

Alaska Teacher Placement- clearinghouse for job vacancies, job fairs, recruitment in lower-forty eight.



Educators Rising Alaska

History

- FY16 move from Future Educators of Alaska to Educators Rising (ER)
- FY17 Educators Rising Curriculum created-high school career pathway
- FY18 Initial adoption of Curriculum by districts
- FY19 28 districts implemented ER curriculum
- FY20 35 districts implementing ER curriculum
- New districts in 2020: Fairbanks, Galena, Juneau, Dillingham,
- Kodiak, Nenana, Hoonah

Looking Forward

- Dual Enrollment course for Educators Rising in Fall 2020
- Middle School Curriculum being developed for Fall 2020
- Annual Conference growing more than 100 students attend



Going Forward

Short term

- Coordinate websites, marketing, recruiting and advising to provide clear pathways for students across the state but especially in Southcentral to pursue paths to teaching licensure in Alaska.
- Continue to ramp up UAF faculty in Anchorage and UAS offerings on-line and in Anchorage-based cohort programs to meet current and expected student demand.
- o Align curricula for initial licensure and advanced programs offered at multiple universities.

Mid term

- Recruit students into the programs
 - UA graduates from other programs: tuition incentives to pursue MAT or M.Ed.?
 - Current UA students: provide clear pathways for moving into teacher programs perhaps through tuition incentives.
 - Preparing Indigenous Teachers & Administrators for Alaska Schools (PITAAS)
 - Future UA students: Educators Rising, Middle College.
- o Assess state needs to reestablish a BA in Early Childhood Education

UAA: Major Approaches to Impact Student Success Outcomes

New First Year Advising and Success Program

- Director + 8 FYAs, including dedicated Alaska Native advisor
- Addressing low first-year retention and success
- Integrated advising and registration into Howl Days orientation
- Improving placement with multiple measures and accelerated learning

Academic Pathway Degree Maps

- Built meta-major pathways to reduce major switching, improve 1st year completion of writing, math, communications, and encourage full-time attendance (12+)
- Leveraged historical pass rate data by placement level to develop datadriven course maps

Seawolf Tracks for Advisors, Faculty, and Students

- Implemented Seawolf Tracks for advisors, faculty, and support units
- Launched Seawolf Tracks student mobile app at orientation for first-year students
- Launched faculty Progress Reports as a pilot in Spring 2019 and with all courses in Fall 2019



UAA: 2019-2020 Student Success Initiatives

Cohort approach to enrollment in firstyear courses Incorporate predictive analytics into Seawolf Tracks Advising

Comprehensive peer assistance model: (1) peer mentors for FTF, (2) peer learning assistants in high impact courses (high enroll//high DFWI), and (3) peer advisors for low-risk students





Scholarship amount between \$1,000-10,000 per year









- Developed in AY19 based on recommendations from Ruffalo Noel Levitz (RNL), and building on McDowell Survey Data
- Creation of Strategic Enrollment Task Force
- Updated Plan has Six Strategic Priorities
 - ☐ Priority 1: First Time Full Time Freshman
 - ☐ Priority 2: Alaska Native Community
 - ☐ Priority 3: Building Campus Community
 - ☐ Priority 4: Building E-Learning/Online Community
 - ☐ Priority 5: Adult Learners
 - ☐ Priority 6: Graduate Students



UAS: Strategic Enrollment Plan

- 2019 first year assessed. Notable gains:
 - Increase in enrolled FTFTF
 - Increase in FTFTF 6 year completion rate
 - Increase in Alaska Native student enrollment
 - Increase in face-to-face program FTE
- Three complimentary sub-plans: recruitment, retention, marketing
 - Updated annually
- Data-informed planning and assessment



UAS: Importance of data-informed decision-making

Institutional Effectiveness data inform all aspects of enrollment management:
