STATE OF ALASKA 2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

The proposed legislation restricts the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) from issuing licenses to school bus applicants who have been convicted of a violation, or an attempt, solicitation, or conspiracy to commit a violation of 11.41.340-11.41.370, which are all varying degrees of sex trafficking crimes.

This bill would not change the way the DMV runs background checks on school bus applicants and would have minimal operational changes therefore the Division is submitting a zero fiscal note.
