FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA 2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This legislation will have minimal financial impact on the Violent Crimes Compensation Board. Over the past 5 years, the Board has only received an average 5 trafficking claims per year. Moreover, even if the number of claims were to increase (should sex trafficking in the second degree also be made a compensable crime), it will not necessarily translate into more financial awards of compensation being made.
When making a determination of eligibility and an award of compensation, the Board not only considers whether the crime is compensable but whether the specific expenses requested are compensable (they must be reasonable and directly related to the crime). The Board may find a claim technically eligible, but still not not necessarily award the expenses requested. For these reasons, the Board submits a zero fiscal note.
