Since September 1, 2019:

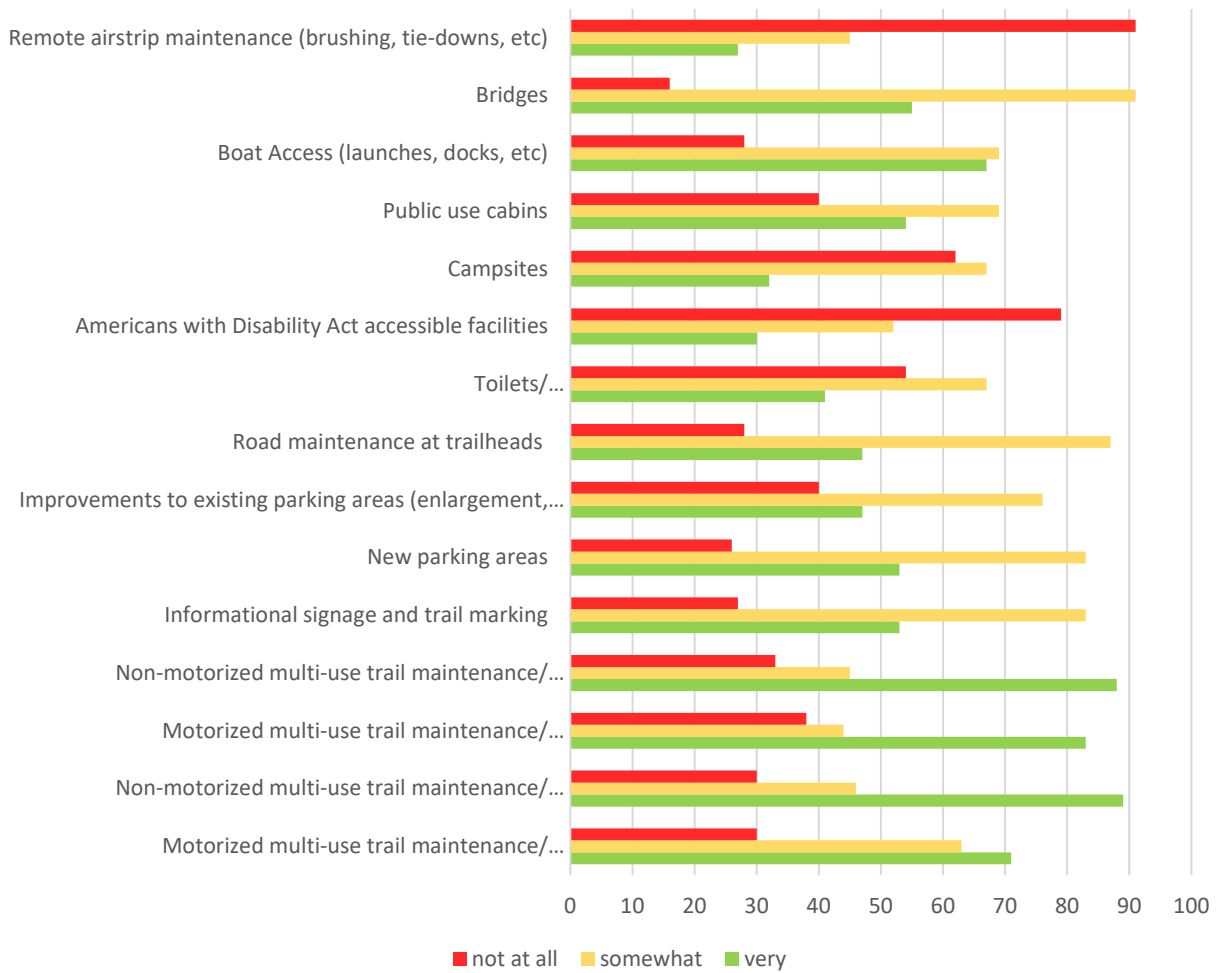
- **167** respondents have participated in the survey
- The Hunter Access grant application web page has been viewed **881** times
- The Hunter Access overview web page has been viewed **516** times
- Total view for all Hunter Access web pages combined are **5,172**
- **10** people have downloaded and received the 2020 Hunter Access grant application materials

Note: An email announcing the call for proposals for the 2020 Hunter Access Grant Program was sent to all Division of Wildlife Conservation staff, shared with all current collaborating entity Project Investigators, shared with entities who have inquired about P-R funding in the last year, shared with Fish and Game Advisory Committee members statewide, posted in the online public notice system, shared on the ADF&G Facebook page and other social media sites, and distributed via an article in the Department's monthly online publication, *Fish and Wildlife News*. In addition, area biologists and other management staff have been disseminating information and consulting with potential access applicants.

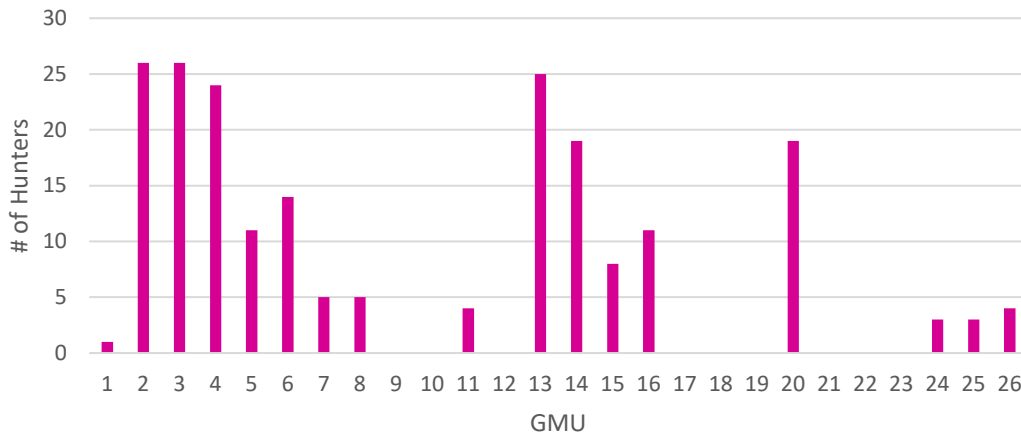

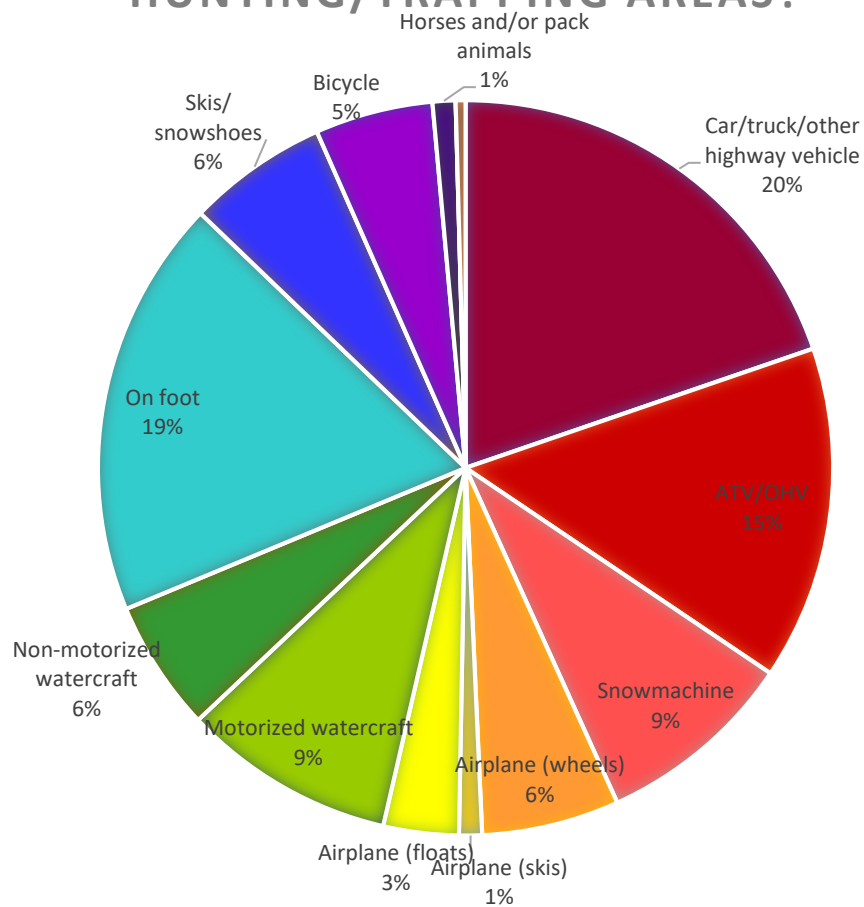
How important are the below..?
