FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

BILL NO. HB 239

Analysis

This legislation establishes a state lottery and criminal penalties for failure to comply with the following proposed statutes:

- 05.18.130 relating to the depositing and reporting of lottery receipts;
- 05.18.140 relating to agents' maintenance of an appropriate bond as determined by the lottery board; and
- 05.18.210 relating to assignments of prizes.

The legislation also proposes to enact statutes which outright prohibit certain activities relating to the Alaska Lottery:

- 05.18.320 prohibiting
 - knowingly selling a lottery ticket without appropriate contract or employment;
 - knowingly selling a lottery ticket at a price other than that fixed by the lottery board;
 - knowingly selling a lottery ticket to a person under 18 years of age;
 - with intent to defraud, falsely making, altering, forging, or counterfeiting lottery tickets; and
 - a retail sales agent, the governor, or an officer, employee, or contractor of the board or the Office of the Governor from purchasing a lottery ticket or collecting of a lottery prize.
- 05.18.330 prohibiting the assignment of a lottery contract without approval of the Board.

A person who violates the above proposed statutes is guilty of a class C felony and may be sentenced to a maximum term of imprisonment for five years under AS 12.55.

The Department of Law anticipates being able to handle any new cases generated by this legislation within existing resources, therefore the department does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation at this time.
