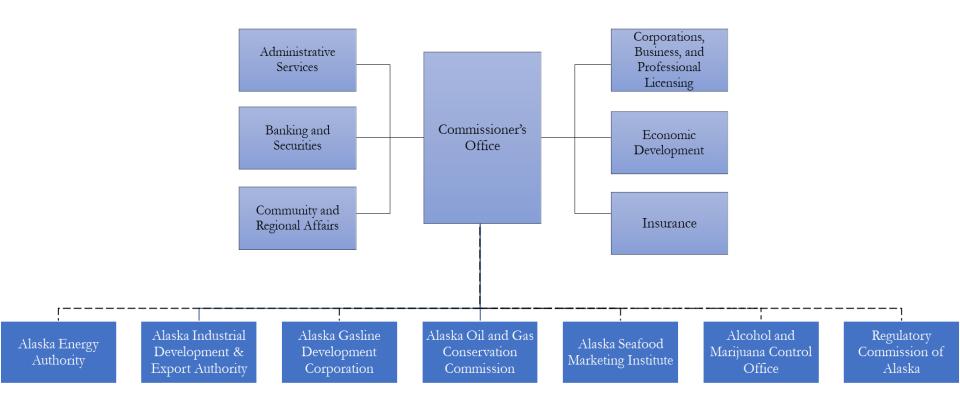

# Noteworthy FY2020 Operating Budget Items

# Reduced General Fund Appropriation to Division of Community and Regional Affairs (-\$1,000.0 UGF)

• DCRA has reorganized local government staff and established a central resource desk to improve responsiveness to local governments. 6 PCN's are deleted in FY21.

# Reduced Economic Development component (-\$239.5 UGF, all other fund sources eliminated)

• DED's budget was reduced by \$1,060.0 across all fund sources in FY2020. Three of the Five economic development component PCNs were deleted.

#### Alaska Legal Services (\$450.0 UGF, \$309.1 DGF)

• Grants for legal assistance and representation in non-criminal matters to Indigent Alaskans that are victims of domestic violence.

#### Travel Reductions (\$807.1 all funds)

• FY2020 50% travel executive branch decrement – AOGCC excluded.



# Noteworthy FY2020 Operating Budget Items

#### **Community Assistance Program**

- The veto of FY2020 Community Assistance Fund capitalization had no impact on the FY2020 distribution of funds for the Community Assistance Program (CAP).
- One third of the June 30 balance of the Community Assistance Fund is distributed at the start of each fiscal year without additional appropriation.
- In FY2020, the distribution was \$30,000.0. With no additional fund capitalization, the FY2021 distribution will be \$20,000.0
- CAP payments consist of base payments and per-capita payments. Per-capita payments are calculated by dividing the amount of funding available after the base payments have been made by the population of Alaska. In FY2021, the per-capita calculation will drop from approximately \$14.00 (real dollars) to \$0.56 (real dollars).

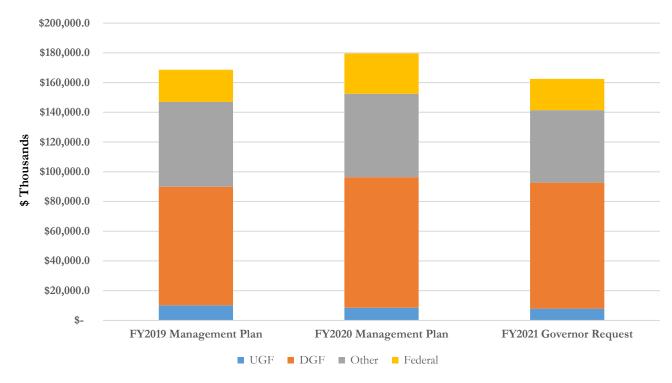

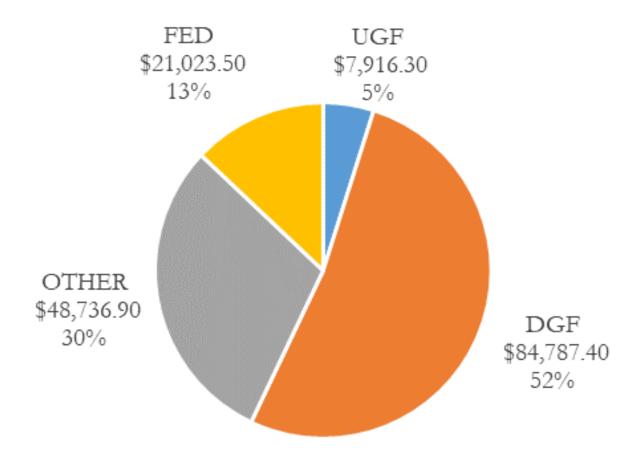

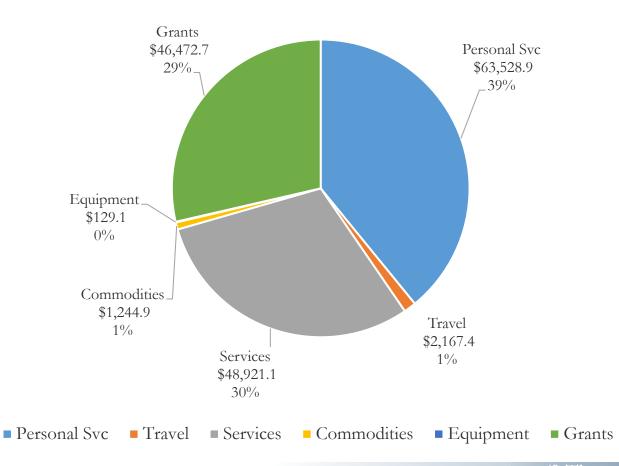
# FY2021 Budget by Fund Source

■ Diomede is now a subsidized Federal DOT Essential Air Service program community. (\$200.0 UGF)

### Eliminate Economic Development Funding to be Replaced by Alaska Development Team

Multi-year pilot program to establish a 501(c)(3) to outsource economic development functions to the private sector. (\$546.6 UGF)/\$2,843.6
 Capstone (DGF) (multi-year)

#### Eliminate Alaska Capstone Avionics Revolving Loan Fund Due to Sunset

Scheduled to sunset June 30, 2020: Investments (\$137.5 Capstone (DGF))

■ Deletion of ten full-time and one temporary positions, reduction by eliminating office space, reducing contracts, travel, and commodity purchases: (\$6,254.0) AGDC-LNG (Other)/ (10) PFT/(1) NP

#### Power Cost Equalization and Endowment Funding

■ Based on historical averages in fuel costs. PCE grant disbursements were \$31.6 million in FY2016; \$26.4 million in FY2017; \$26.2 million in FY2018, estimated to be \$28.7 million in FY2019 and \$29.7 million in FY2020. (\$2,500.0) PCE Endow (DGF)

# Banking and Securities

**Division of Banking and Securities:** Protecting consumers of financial services and promoting safe and sound financial systems.

DBS charters, licenses, and registers financial institutions and products, investigates and enforces consumer complaints, conducts examinations, and accepts Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) filings.



Director Patrice Walsh

- FY2021 Operating Budget: \$4,052.8 (DGF), 25 PFT, 1 NP
- Collected \$18,231.5 in fees in FY2019 contributing \$14,688.5 to the General Fund
- Reallocated budget resources to manage current agency needs including reclassification of a Regulations Specialist to a Financial Examiner



#### Division of Insurance

**Division of Insurance:** Regulating the insurance industry to protect Alaskan consumers

DOI is responsible for the licensing and compliance of insurers and insurance products in Alaska.

- FY2021 Operating Budget: \$7,832.9: \$7,276.0 (DGF)/\$279.2 (OTH)/\$277.7 (FED), 46 PFT
- DOI collected \$77,261.0 in Insurance Premium Taxes in FY2019, \$71,862.1 of which was deposited into the General Fund
- FY2020 \$277.0 (FED) and RPL \$199.7 (FED) for Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Flexibility Grant
- Replace Funding Source -\$20.1 CIP Rcpts/+\$20.1 SDPR: National Association of Insurance Commissioners annual grant for staff training and NAIC conference attendance
- Delete Office Assistant -\$70.7: Multi-year scanning project is no longer a full time job, paper records are being scanned into electronic database for retention



### Community and Regional Affairs

Division of Community and Regional Affairs: Promoting strong communities and healthy economies

DCRA provides training and technical assistance to local governments, assists communities with land management and planning, houses the State Assessor's Office and the Alaska Native Language Preservation and Advisory Council, administers grants, and distributes funding.



Director Sandra Moller

- FY2021 Operating Budget: \$9,051.3: \$5,425.2 (UGF)/\$647.2 (DGF)/\$972.4 (OTHER), \$2,006.5 (Fed), 47 PFT
- Significant changes: Made in Alaska, Alaska Forest Products, and Alaska Regional Development Organizations (ARDOR) programs transferred from the Division of Economic Development in FY2020
- Taken over department reporting requirements previously assigned to the Division of Economic Development (Alaska Minerals Commission, Cruise Ship Head Tax)
- -\$200.0 UGF: Essential Air Service Grant (FAA Reauthorization Act 2018, sunsets 2023)
- DCRA has reorganized local government staff, reduced total PCN count by six, and established a central resource desk to improve responsiveness to local governments



### Community and Regional Affairs

#### Serve Alaska

Serve Alaska fosters, supports, and promotes the ethic of service and volunteerism for Alaskans.

• FY2021 Operating Budget: \$2,125.4: \$216.3 (UGF)/\$20.0 (OTH)/\$1,889.1 (Fed), 2 PFT

#### **Revenue Sharing**

DCRA administers several revenue sharing programs, including:

- Fisheries Taxes \$3,100.0 (Other)
- National Forest Receipts \$600.0 (Fed)
- Payment in Lieu of Taxes \$10,428.2 (Fed)

The Community Assistance Program (CAP) provides funding to the municipalities, unincorporated communities, and Native village councils.

- The FY2021 distribution is calculated at \$20 million
- Distribution is one third of the Community Assistance Fund balance from the prior fiscal year and does not require an additional appropriation
- The FY2021 fund capitalization is \$28.7 million



# Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing

#### Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing:

Inspiring public confidence through balanced regulation of competent professional and business services

CBPL administers 43 professional licensing programs, licenses businesses and registers corporations to do business in Alaska, issues tobacco endorsements, and protects consumers through investigative functions.

- FY2021 Operating Budget: \$14,652.3: \$14,280.3 (DGF)/\$372.0 (OTH), 97 PFT
- CBPL deposited \$8,340.4 to the General Fund in FY2019
- 43 Professional Licensing Programs
  - 21 programs administered by a board with departmental support
  - 22 programs administered solely by the division



# Division of Economic Development

**Division of Economic Development:** Promoting economic development in Alaska

The Investments component provides direct loan programs for Alaskans, increasing access to capital to support economic opportunity.



Deputy Director Jim Andersen

- FY2021 Operating Budget: \$5,303.9 (DGF), 37 PFT
- Significant changes: The Alaska Capstone Avionics revolving loan fund sunsets June 30, 2020
- The Alaska Capstone Avionics Revolving Loan Fund was created in 2008 as part of a joint industry effort to improve aviation safety and economic efficiency in Alaska by financing the installation of a new generation of avionics. It was intended to make the avionics more accessible to the Alaskan aviation community through the use of long term, low interest loans.
- There are currently six (6) outstanding loans totaling \$128.0. One loan application is currently in process, one was approved in November, 2020.



# Division of Economic Development (cont.)

Alaska Development Team Vision Statement: Enabling a flourishing private sector economy that brings job opportunities to the state and increases prosperity and self-sufficiency for Alaskan families

The Alaska Development Team (AKDT) is focused on promoting growth of existing Alaskan businesses, encouraging new Businesses to invest in Alaska, and creating an economic environment that is favorable for business development.



Deputy Commissioner John Springsteen

- FY 2021 Operating Budget: \$0.0, 3 PFT, 3 NP (year two of a multi-year operating appropriation)
- Significant changes: FY2020 Supplemental budget appropriation of \$2,843.6 (multi-year DGF) which equates to approximately \$947.0 per year, \$625.0 in personal services.
- Significant changes: FY2021 decrease of \$546.6 (UGF)



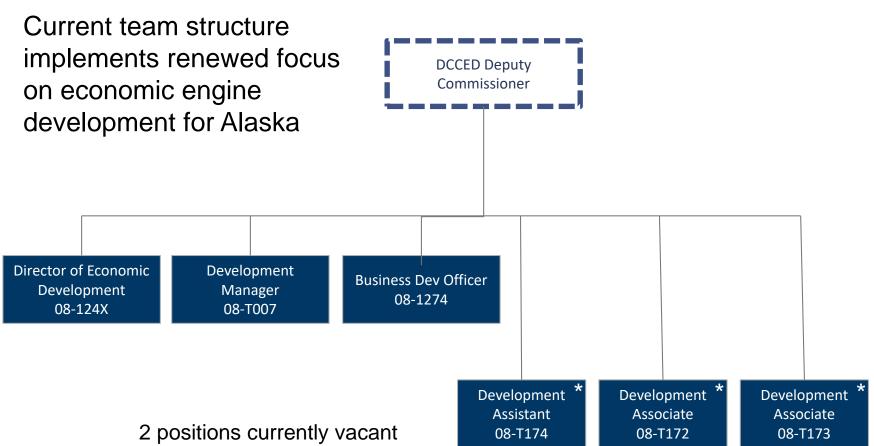
# FY2020 Division of Economic Development

FY2020 budgeted positions for economic development \$547.6





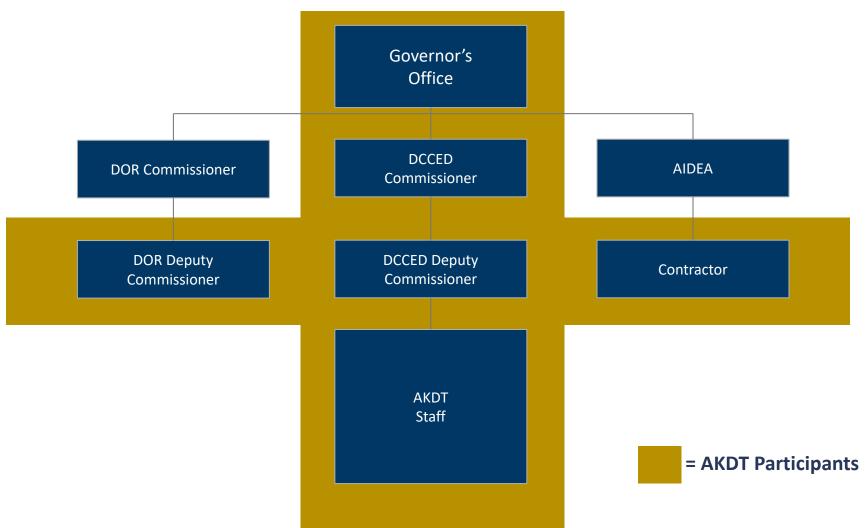
