BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the <u>Mortgage Bankers Association</u> and the <u>American Land Title Association</u> have collaborated to create model legislation to help states adopt a process for remote online notarization with strong safeguards; and

WHEREAS an electronic closing is generally any real estate closing event or process in which the buyer, seller, borrower, notary or others use an electronic signature to sign some or all of the closing documents; and

WHEREAS real estate transactions nationally are going digital to create a better closing experience while reducing risks for all parties; and

WHEREAS this transformation must be carefully managed to avoid a negative impact on land ownership records and mortgage financing; and

WHEREAS a large portion of transactions, real estate and other conducted within the state of Alaska necessitates delays, often times for days, due to the requirement to ship documents via surface transport between multiple parties for the purpose of notarization; and

WHEREAS poorly deployed electronic closings with weak processes can make it difficult to detect serious problems like fraud, duress, elder abuse, and mental incapacity that create substantial risk of claims unless stopped in advance; and

WHEREAS electronic closings enhance the closing experience for all the parties involved while improving efficiency; and

WHEREAS consumers benefit from increased convenience and more time to review documents before signing with electronic signing, which helps accelerate the final closing with shorter signing appointments; and

WHEREAS a well-designed electronic closing process can give borrowers and sellers more time to review documents in advance of the closing, prevent "missed signatures" on documents at the closing, enable the efficient and accurate distribution of executed documents to the parties, create a seamless process for recording documents upon closing, and reduce post-closing "clean-up" work;

NOW BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Alaska Land Title Association Board of Directors hereby requests the 31st Alaska Legislature to sponsor legislation that will authorize an electronic notary signature and stamp that provides safeguards proposed in the model legislation: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska Land Title Association supports the passage and enactment of the model legislation.

An electronic closing using a remote online notarization will create convenience and better security for consumers, notaries, lenders, and other industry stakeholders. We appreciate Alaska's willingness to be a pioneer in the evolution of the notarial acts, and while finalizing remote online notarization legislation, we ask the committee to consider the following:

 The first and greatest value is consumer choice. They would have the option to conduct their closing anywhere through a digital, paperless experience and all without the burden of having to be physically present.

- The next value is notary choice. Allowing the notary to have the choice to utilize the
 advancement in technology to offer their consumers a more efficient and secure ability to sign
 their closing documents. Also, this extends the notaries' ability to operate throughout with less
 travel time which allows the notary to perform more closings.
- The third and last value is technology choice of a more secure notarial experience. Advancements in identity verification which use public data sources and client specific questions to prove a client's identity, as well as an independent third-party authentication of a client's state issued id helps to keep the process more secure for consumers. To further cement the increased security and fraud deterrence for remote online notarization process, an audio-video recording is made of the notarial act and retained for a future review if the need should ever arise.

Conclusion

Thank you again for your consideration as you work to finalize remote online notarization legislation and electronic records. By embracing these two important enhancements we will be able to streamline and improve the convenience and security of the mortgage closing process in a world where people are constantly on the move.
