Analysis

This bill creates additional aggravators to be considered at sentencing as a basis for increased penalties. It also adds crimes committed against individuals on the basis of their sexual orientation or gender identity to the current list of aggravators based on the identity of the victim.

The Agency does not anticipate a significant number of cases appointed to the Agency based on the circumstances described and therefore does not anticipate a significant increase in workload; accordingly, the Agency submits a zero fiscal note.
