HB 240 requires the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) to periodically test for perfluoroalkyl substances and polyfluoroalkyl substances in all drinking water. It also requires the DEC to publish notice of alternative firefighting substances to perfluoroalkyl substances and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) when the state Fire Marshall under the Department of Public Safety (DPS) determines there is an effective alternative. Currently there are no alternative methods to using PFAS to extinguish large oil and gas fires.		
When an alternative becomes available, DPS can make the determination using existing resources. There is no fiscal impact on DPS.
