Hi Konrad,

Here are some things that could be considered sport fishing facilities. We've also included some additional enhancement core services items.

Crooked Creek

Used as a brood collection and egg-take site and fish passage monitoring, recently upgraded raceways.

Eklutna Hatchery

Used as a smolt release site and has considerable earthquake damage.

Fort Richardson Hatchery

This is lumped in with the William Jack in the stocking FAQ. However, it is currently used as a housing facility.

Ward Lake ADA Fishing Platform (Ketchikan)

A collaborative project with the US-Forest Service. A popular recreational area on the Ketchikan road system.

Naha River Trail Improvements (north of Ketchikan)

A collaborative project with the US-Forest Service. A 6-mile long trail that leads to three high-value fishing lakes.

Sheep Creek Stairwell Improvements/Renovation and Vault Latrine Replacement (Upper Cook Inlet)

A collaborative project with ADNR-DPOR for the removal and replacement of a deteriorating latrine, trail renovations, fence/retaining wall renovations.

Nick Dudiak Fishing Lagoon ADA Ramp and Retaining Wall Renovation (Homer-Kodiak Area)

Cooperative project with the City of Homer for renovation of ADA compliant angler-access walkways. Original walkways were constructed in 1999 and are in poor shape with little functionality.

Fort Abercrombie State Historical Park/Lake Gertrude ADA Accessible Fishing Platform (Kodiak Area)

Another cooperative project with ADNR-DPOR for construction of a small ADA compliant fishing platform that would provide access along the lakeshore to a popular rainbow trout fishing area within this popular park on the Kodiak road system.

Bells Flat Trail Improvement Project (Kodiak Area)

Cooperative project with Kodiak Island Borough to improve trails to Aurel, Caroline, Cicely and Lee Lakes. Very popular lakes stocked by ADF&G with rainbows. Trails are overgrown and difficult to follow.

Misc.

A long term strategy for IT upgrades and maintenance is needed at the hatchery facilities.
