FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill raises the minimum age requirement for purchase, sale, exchange, or possession of tobacco products and electronic smoking products from the previous 19 years of age to 21 years of age under most circumstances. However, if person is an active member of the armed forces then they may purchase or possess tobacco products or electronic smoking products at the age of 18. Possession of tobacco products by an underage person and sale of tobacco products to an underage person are violations. As such, the Criminal Division rarely gets involved in these cases.

The Department of Law does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.
